From our Director

Hello!

I am excited to share with you what's happening right now with Benzie Senior Resources. We have partnered with many agencies in Northwest Michigan to listen to the voices of our community's older adults in an effort to better understand what seniors need in order to live healthy, better lives. This summer-long project kicked-off with a survey of seniors living in Antrim, Benzie, Charlevoix, Emmet, Grand Traverse, Kalkaska, Leelanau, Manistee, Missaukee and Wexford Counties. We are doing this to focus on our increased senior population and to learn what this means for our communities.

Area Agencies on Aging are required to do senior needs assessments every three years so it made sense for all of our agencies to pool our resources, expertise and community connections. Our goal is to reach as many seniors as possible living in the area, including those who summer here. Getting the survey out far and wide is a community effort, and we're hoping other agencies who work with older adults, aside from us, such as service and faith-based organizations, and senior advocacy networks will join us in this effort.

This project will allow us to zero-in on senior needs now and in the future. The survey uses a wide lens, looking at quality of life from several different angles including health and wellbeing, the use of healthcare services, being able to afford food, housing and transportation, caregiving, and the ability to manage daily activities.

Many area organizations and networks will use the final report, due out in late fall or early winter. The report will include additional data sources to help tell the story of our older population in Northwest Michigan.

For Benzie county, I am looking at whether services offered by the agency could include expanding The Gathering Place or creating new satellite senior centers, and whether new programs related to health and fitness and education and the arts should be offered.

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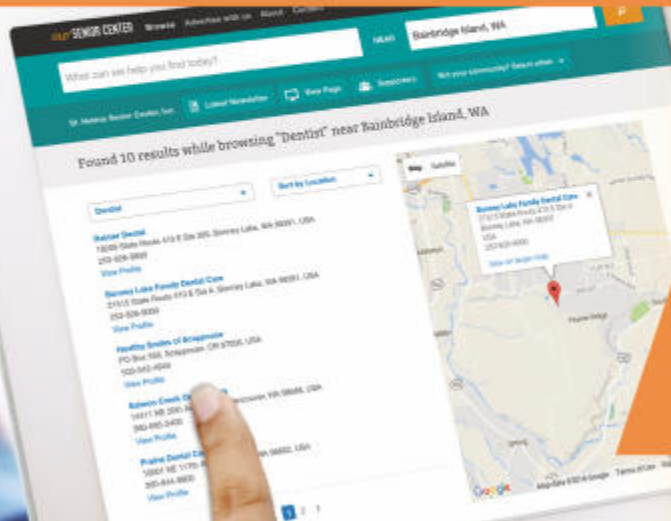

The Gathering Place is working with Taste the Local Difference to improve our meals. Thanks to funds from the Building Healthy Communities grant, this partnership is catering meals to meet nutritional needs of older adults while simultaneously incorporating more fresh, local produce into our meals.

What do we mean by nutritional needs of older adults? Chronic diseases like heart disease become an increasing concern as we age, and the nutrients we put into our bodies can either contribute to or reduce our risk. High sodium diets can increase blood pressure, risk of hypertension, and heart disease. On the other hand, potassium can help offset the effects of sodium on blood pressure. Therefore, we've altered some menu items to lower the sodium content and raise the potassium content. Sodium is commonly found in high concentrations in processed foods and seasonings while potassium is high in fruits and vegetables. This means these adjustments are also raising the content of other important nutrients such as fiber. It's a win-win!

What about local produce? The Gathering Place is buying local salad greens from Grow Benzie. We are also sourcing other items from Cherry Capital Foods Hub. By buying local goods, we are supporting the local economy and providing fresh produce for you!

Because we would love your feedback on the changes that were made, we are holding a taste test on July 13th in the dining room at The Gathering Place. Please join us, let us know your thoughts, and ask any questions!

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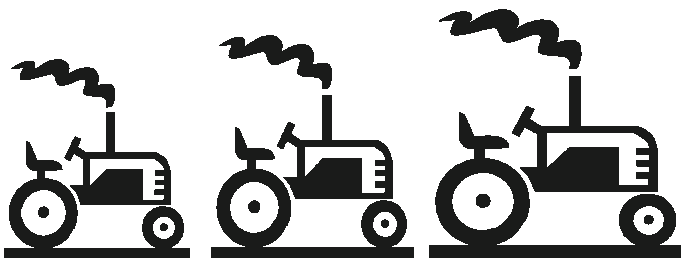

Medicare

How to File a Complaint

You can file a complaint if you have concerns about the quality of care or other services you get from a Medicare provider. How you file a complaint depends on what your complaint is about.

You can file a complaint about:

- A doctor, hospital, or provider
- Your health or drug plan
- Quality of your care
- Your dialysis or kidney transplant care
- Durable medical equipment

What's the difference between a complaint and an appeal?

A complaint is about the quality of care you got or are getting. For example, you may file a complaint for one of these:

- You have a problem calling the plan
- You're unhappy with how a staff person at the plan has treated you

An appeal is the action you can take if you disagree with a coverage or payment decision made by Medicare, your Medicare health plan, or your Medicare Prescription Drug Plan. You can appeal if Medicare or your plan denies one of these:

- Your request for a health care service, supply, item, or prescription drug
- Your request for payment for a health care service, supply, item, or prescription drug you've already purchased
- Your request to change the amount you pay for a health care service, supply, item or prescription drug

You can also appeal if Medicare or your plan stops providing or paying for all or part of a service, supply, item, or prescription drug you think you still need. If you have a [Medicare Medical Savings Account \(MSA\) Plan](#), you may appeal if you've met your deductible or you believe a service or item should count toward your deductible.

If you decide to appeal, ask your doctor, health care provider, or supplier for any information that may help your case. See your plan materials, or contact your plan for details about your appeal rights.

Generally, you can find your plan's contact information on your plan membership card. Or, you can get your plan's contact information from a [Personalized Search \(under General Search\)](#), or [search by plan name](#).

The appeals process has 5 levels. If you disagree with the decision made at any level of the process, you can generally go to the next level. At each level, you'll be given instructions in the decision letter on how to move to the next level of appeal.

For questions about a specific service you got, look at your [Medicare Summary Notice \(MSN\)](#) or [log into MyMedicare.gov](#). You can file an appeal if you disagree with a coverage or payment decision made by one of these:

- Medicare
- Your Medicare health plan
- Your Medicare Prescription Drug Plan
