

Entertainment will be provided on the back patio by The Benzie Playboys, our local grammy-nominated Zydeco band, from 7:00 p.m. until 9:00 p.m. No Cover Charge!

While the state-wide average yield is around 3,000 to 4,000 pounds per acre, many growers achieve significantly higher yields, reaching 6,000 -7,000 pounds or even more in some plantings.



## **Community Partner Support**



This is Pothole Pete out front at the Benzie County Road Commission. Under his right arm facing us is one of our home delivered meals vehicles. Without the BCRC crews out on the roads, and their vehicle maintenance crew, we would not be able to get around for our seniors-- for meals, for home care, not for anything. We are interdependent, and our end of it is to share how important their needs are with our community.

There will be a millage in August, or possibly November that will determine if new headquarters for the road commission at the site of the former Platte River Elementary School will be possible. The plans include truck barns, maintenance shops, offices and utilities designed to accommodate newer vehicles with larger bays and multiple entrances for improved traffic flow.

The original building went up in 1934. Since then additions have been made, time has passed, equipment has been evolving. There are structural issues due to time and material erosion, corrosion. The current facility lacks a fire suppression system. A new building would be around \$18 million which likely gave sticker shock to voters last fall. If approved, a millage wouldn't be levied until 2026 or 2027, and that total amount shall be for a period not to exceed 20 years.

The Benzie County Road Commission is near and dear to me because my dad was a heavy equipment operator for BCRC from some time in the early 1960's until he had to retire due to health issues in 1985. I learned how to tell time so I would know when he would be home. His coveralls hanging in the hallway held the scent of heat and work and road dust. His plow route was M22. One time he slid sideways down Stratton Hill. It was the only time mother had to take him a change of clothes. Some of the guys still call finding a treasure alongside the road finding a "Joe" --he had a hawk's eye and could spot a lost wrench or whatever a quarter mile up the road.

Please consider how important it is to keep each other safe on these roads, especially during the winter months. Support for our community partner, the Benzie County Road Commission is crucial.




